Only weeks after being diagnosed, for a second time, with Leukemia, Jonathan’s sister, Michele, went home to be with the Lord. She was 36 years old, married to her loving husband Mike, with two children, Dawn (10) and Jorden (8).

The overall theme of her life was her love for God and desire to serve Him. Michele faithfully helped lead the children’s ministries at Batavia Baptist Church in Batavia, AR. She loved children and taught Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. Her testimony lives on in the children that she was able to lead to the Lord and has continued on after her passing. A young girl named Lilly attended her funeral. Michele had spoken with Lilly several times during Sunday School about her need for Christ. Jonathan’s father preformed the services, during which he shared Michele’s own words from a gospel tract that she had written after her first battle with Leukemia. God used Michele’s words from her Sunday School class and her written words to plant, water, and harvest a seed in Lilly’s heart. After the funeral, Lilly came forward and put her faith in Christ. Michele’s husband, Mike, was given the gift of leading this little girl, whom Michele loved and prayed for, to her Savior. What a scene that must have been in Heaven as Michele was rejoicing alongside the angels, that a new soul that was saved. One thing is clear; God was glorified by Michele’s life.

As a family we all strive to carry on her legacy for Christ: Her parents, through their continued pastoring and hospice work; her sister and brother-in-law, as they partner to plant a church in Colorado; and through us as we continue to serve in Guatemala.

Please continue to keep us in your prayers as we have returned to our home in Guatemala after attending the funeral service. Jonathan has resumed his Spanish lessons and we are pressing on, in order to see God glorified through our lives and ministry in Guatemala.

as we partner for this great missionary endeavor.

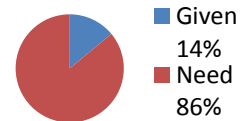
